THE J S BACH SCHOLARSHIP

Rules

1. The scholarship shall be called "The J S Bach Scholarship".
2. The purpose of the scholarship, established in the tricentennial anniversary year of the birth of the great Lutheran composer and organist, Johann Sebastian Bach, shall be to encourage organists, musicians or vocalists to further develop their musical talent, so as to more effectively contribute to the worship life of congregations within the LCNZ.
3. The scholarship shall be funded by an annual grant from legacy income of the LCNZ, the amount to be determined from time to time by the LCNZ Council of Synod but not being less than \$500.00 per annum.
4. The scholarship shall be awarded annually to a person or persons selected by the Council of Synod, from applications received. In the event that no award is made in any one year, two scholarships may be awarded in the following year, or the amount of the scholarship may be increased in that year.
5. Applications for the scholarship shall be forwarded to the LCNZ office, no later than October 31 each year. Applicants shall be members of the LCNZ, who are practising or potential organists, musicians or vocalists in one of the congregations of the LCNZ.
6. Applications shall be accompanied by references from the pastor and chairman or elder of the congregation of which the applicant is a member. An outline of intended use to which the scholarship money will be put is to be included with the application.
